About the University: Thiruvalluvar University was established in Vellore by the government of Tamilnadu in October 2002 under the Thiruvalluvar University Act, 2002. The P.G Extension Centre of the University of Madras, which was functioning in Vellore before 2002, Prof. Dr. K. Murugan D.Sc formed the core of Thiruvalluvar University. The

University was inaugurated on 16.10.2002 as State University and it is located in a sprawling serene campus of about 112.68 acres at Serkkadu near Vallimalai about sixteen kilometers away from Vellore

Theme of the Conference: Subalternity, a major concern in socio-cultural, economic and political spheres, is the focus of this seminar. In an unrefined sense, any individual/socio-cultural group, who/which is pushed to the peripheries of the given society and finds himself/itself deprived, dejected and subordinated in his/its social life, is defined as the subaltern. Behind this inequality in any society, the emancipatory politics plays the lead role, which has a multifaceted approach. From the skin colour to gender, birth to death, a lot of factors like caste, colour, race, gender, sexual orientation, ability/disability etc stand within the subaltern umbrella, which forces some specific groups of people to be devoid of the fundamental rights that they actually deserve as citizens of the set-up. Despite the availability of certain shared reasons for such discriminatory

practices and irrational justifications, the characters of the subaltern politics are divergent according to places and space.

In India, the primary roots of subalternity lie in religion, caste, and class hierarchies. In some cases, subalternity is created by the alleged linguistic inferiority determined by the social location of different communities. Then again in the global context, gender based/biased subalternity is a very common face of social discrimination. Contrary to the charity based approach, the Subaltern Studies Movement endeavours to relocate the subaltern groups in the focal flow of the society and the impact of such an attempt is the voice of the voiceless. Literature-Indian as well as the world- witnesses the conflicts between equality and inequality. All subaltern writings-be it Dalit literature, or Black Literature, or the Aboriginal Literature, or the First Nations Literature, or the Transgender Literature, or the Tribal Literature or the Feminist writings or the Literature of the disabled or Children's Literature etc., certainly have identified and acquired the right agency to speak of their own sufferings and identity.

The success of the deliberation on subaltern literatures will certainly be a sincere and honest attempt to synchronize the marginalized discourses that were hitherto denied an attentive ear among the mainstream literatures written in different regional as well as vernacular languages of modern era. The main sources of the discourse of this sort have been the issues of subalternity since 19th century. While the dominant hegemonic discourses/ mainstream literatures signal the roots of differences, the subaltern writings resist the very pedestal of the mainstream with its cry for equality of all human beings. The social, philosophical and/or religious reforms or movements like Ambedkar's Dalit Movement and Harlem movement in the West have become the momentous logos in the journey of relocating the subaltern. In fact subaltern literatures indefatigably chronicle rather document these social changes. In addition to literatures, films, dramas or other media can also be included as literary texts, which time and again involve themselves by questioning and reconfiguring subalternity.
